

CAP 11th Summer Activity (Class of 2023) A. P. World History: Modern

In 11th Grade AP World History: Modern, the first semester comprehensive theme is marginalized voices. Who is heard and who is ignored? Why? Who is represented in social media and traditional media and how accurate is that representation? Why? What are the political, economic and social consequences of that representation for the individual, group and larger society? The following is a list of people often considered marginalized. This list is not complete. It is just a sample of groups. Some people may be included in more than one group.

Task for Completion

- Each student will choose **one (1) focus group**. Some people are included in more than one group.
- **Monitor two (2) specific** social media and or traditional media platforms for four (4) weeks.
(For example, Instagram & The Washington Post. Both can be social media or both traditional)
- Each student will maintain a social media / traditional media journal for **only four (4) weeks**.
- Each weekly summary blog entry will be a **well-written paragraph (total of 4 weeks/4 paragraphs)**, describing and analyzing how the marginalized group is represented in social media / traditional media for that week. Include any specific details related to events of that week.
 - a. **Identify the week** of the journal entry. They do not have to be consecutive weeks.
 - b. Be sure to provide an **original title** for each week's entry.
 - c. Each weekly journal entry should be recorded in the student's **CAP blog**.
- **This is due** the end of the week we start Fall Semester 2021-2022 (September 3rd).
- **Be prepared** to share your analysis and observations with the class during Fall Semester 2021.
